FINLAND TODAY

First, twenty one years ago the Lutheran Church of Finland allowed women to become pastors, but a small group of male clergy remain strongly opposed to their ordination. The opposition group, about 2% of the total clergy are a vocal group that has caused embarrassment to the Church, and a decline in Church membership.

Today, about a third of all clergy are women. Female pastors are expected to outnumber male pastors by the year 2015.

Membership in the Lutheran Church of Finland has been on a decline. Today, 82.4% of Finland's 5.3 million inhabitants are members of the Church, down from 90% in the 1950's, and from 85% a decade ago.

Finland's Realia Group, real estate company, has bought a leading Baltic property dealer, Ober Haus. Ober Haus has real estate operations in Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, Poland and Ukraine. Ober Haus also owns and administers shopping malls in Estonia.

With this purchase, Realia expects it is on its way to becoming the largest real estate company in Eastern and Central Europe. Risto Kyhala, managing director of Realia: "Naturally we will go to Russia, we are now building a bridge for it."

Nokia, the Finnish cell phone giant, has announced that it will reorganize into three units: Devices, Services and Software and Markets.

The three units will replace the current divisions of Mobile Phones, which produce the cheapest models: Enterprise Solutions, which has products for the business markets; and Multimedia, which makes cell phones with advanced cameras and music players.

Nokia will also restructure its financial reporting into two segments: Devices and Services; and Nokia Siemens Networks, which is Nokia's infrastructure joint venture with Germany's Siemens

Nokia Siemens Networks also announced a contract worth \$900 million to expand the infrastructure of Bharti Airtel cellular system in India.

Kone, the Finnish elevator company has acquired UAB Elektros Pavara, a Lithuanian elevator company. With this purchase, Kone becomes the leading elevator company in the Baltic countries. Elektros Pavara already has had a working relationship with Kone since 1992, distributing Kone products and providing service.

Kone is one of the leading elevator and escalator companies in the world. In 2006, Kone had annual sales of about \$4 billion, and about 29,000 employees.

Persuasive 2008, the International Conference of Persuasive Technology, will be held in Oulu, Finland in June, 2008.

Persuasive 2008 will bring together people interested in how computers can change people's attitudes and behaviors. This conference will feature the best insights into how video games, mobile phone applications, and web sites can be designed to motivate and influence people. Persuasive 2007 was held at Stanford University.

The Finnish media concern, SanomaWSOY is in the process of purchasing the Polish educational material concern, Nowa Eran. Nowa Eran will become a part of SanomaWSOY Education Division.

According to a SanomaWSOY spokes person, "It's another step for SanomaWSOY to become the leading educational material publisher in Europe."

Profile Vehicles Oy of Iisalmi, Finland has received a contract from the Kuwait Health Ministry to build 51 "special express ambulances." Profile Vehicles is the largest producer of ambulances in the Nordic and Baltic countries.

Pamela Anderson to open a chain of strip clubs to "honor" her Finnish heritage? Pamela Anderson was recently in Finland hosting the Live Earth concert held near Helsinki.

On her website she writes: "I thought of a great way to celebrate my Finnish heritage at home. I'm going to look into opening a chain of strip clubs and I'll call them Lapland."

Also in an open letter to President Halonen, Anderson said that Finland should emulate other countries and ban fur farms. Finland is the leading producer of blue fox furs.

SCHOLARSHIP INTERVIEW

This month you will read the final interview of the university students who received scholarships for the 2006-07 academic year, Michael Zurek. In fact, the FCA is now accepting scholarship applications for the current year, 2007-08. Read elsewhere in the Newsletter for information about how to submit an application and about how to donate to the scholarship fund.

Michael attends Johnson Bible College which is located in Knoxville, TN. He has completed his first year and is now beginning his second year with plans to graduate in 2010. He is in a dual major program: Counseling and Bible.

- Q: What was your favorite class last year, and why was it your favorite? A: My favorite class from the spring semester was my History of Israel course. The reason why I enjoyed this class so much was because it was pretty much all new material. While some of my other classes also had new material, this class was also taught in a manner in which I felt that it appealed to me the most.
- **Q:** What are your career plans? A: I would ultimately like to help people. As of right now, the plan is to become involved in the ministry of providing counseling to families.
- **Q:** Do you have a mentor who has helped you with career planning? A: I do not have any mentor in particular that has helped me, but there have been many people who have impacted me throughout the years.

- Q: What activities do you participate in? A: I participated in intramural soccer in the spring. As the school year went on, I became actively involved in the college ministry at my church. We had a coffee house with music and did an outreach to the students at the University of Tennessee once a month. I did some volunteer work at an urban church in Knoxville where I was a leader for an after school program offered for elementary school children. I did not have a work study or off campus job either semester of my first year, but I am taking up a Teacher's Assistant (TA) job in the fall.
- **Q:** How has the FCA scholarship helped you meet your educational goals? A: The FCA scholarship money that I received is currently part of a collection of savings in the bank. My father and stepmother have agreed to pay for my first three years, minus the cost of books. I will be responsible for any schooling after that. The scholarship money will be saved for when I will be responsible for paying for my own schooling.
- Q: What advice would you give to high school students?

A: It is important to stay focused on what you want. Set goals and measurable means to accomplish these goals. Don't allow yourself to give up. You can be whatever you want to be if you put the work in. With regards to preparing for college, start developing good study habits. College work is very time-demanding and those habits are extremely helpful to have going into college.

FROM THE FCA LIBRARY

We have added the following new books to our library:

JOHN MORTON, FORGOTTEN FOUNDING

FATHER by Elaine Tikka Lillback. Most of us know that one of the signers of the Declaration of Independence was a Finn, but how much more do you know about him? Elaine Lillback has thoroughly researched not only the life of John Morton, but also his ancestry going back several generations.

The Marttinen family (for that is what their name was before it was anglicized to Morton in the U.S.) originally came from Rautalampi, Finland, where there is a memorial to those who moved to Sweden and then to the Delaware colony. Lillback gives quite a bit of the history of the Marttinens before they left Finland, including reasons for their departure. The trip across the ocean on the Ärn (Swedish for "Eagle") was a grueling 4-month ordeal, which many did not survive. They arrived in Delaware in 1654.

John Morton, Jr. was the great-grandson of the original immigrant, Marten Martenson Sr. He married a Finnish girl, Ann Justis (Juustinen). They were blessed with eleven children. He was well educated and highly respected in his area. He was elected to the provincial assembly in Philadelphia where he served for ten years, and served as well in many other official government positions. As a representative to the Continental Congress he became one of the signers of the Declaration of Independence, his signature written below that of his friend Benjamin Franklin.

Lillback has written a very interesting and informative account of the early days of our country. The book is enhanced not only by numerous photos but also by well-done artistry by the author. You'll find the book in biography, in alphabetical order under Morton (MO).

THE HELSINKI CHRONICLES OF DR LOUISE C. LOVE AND MR. P. by Arthur M.

Alexander. This delightful book is half fiction, half non-fiction! The fictional sleuth Dr. Love is in Finland with her assistant and her beloved dog, Mr. P., to solve a mystery. Their travels take them just about everywhere in Helsinki, solving not only that mystery but a couple of others, as well. The most dangerous one with the aid of Mr. P.!

The fictional part is highly asterisked, referring to footnotes at the end of each chapter, which give a non-fictional description of all the sights they encounter. The footnotes are, in fact, a travel guide and a good one at that. Whether or not you've ever been to Helsinki, it will be very informative. You'll find the book in fiction under the author's last name, but don't forget it's not all fiction!

LOOKING BACK: GROWING UP IN THE

NEVA by Helmi Koivisto. No, the Neva referred to here is not the river in Russia, but rather an area near Sault Ste. Marie, Michigan on Seymour Road, which the Finns called Neva (she doesn't explain why.)

Helmi's parents came to America from Finland in the early 1900's, living first in Rudyard, and then "in the Neva". She talks about what life was like for the early immigrants. She doesn't moan and groan about hardships but makes it sound like a lot of fun! She describes life around the house, the farm, school, games the children played, and so on.

Older folks will enjoy this trip back to "the olden days" and youngsters will get a good picture of what their grandparents' life was like. It's an enjoyable book. You'll find it in biography, under Koivisto (KO).
