FINLAND TODAY

FINLAND TODAY

First, call it "global warming", but something is even going on in Finland. It was a "safe bet" to hold the first Alpine skiing World Cup event of season in Levi, which is in the Finnish Lapland. But because there wasn't enough snow, the event had to be moved to Reiteralm, Austria. Levi didn't have snow until the first week of November. It was a big loss for the tourist industry in Finland, especially Lapland. Also it was a lost opportunity for the Finnish media to show case the Lapland region, and all of Finland.

In spite of what happened this year, Levi is still scheduled to host the opening events of the FIS slalom world cup for the next four years.

Russia's economy is surging, and it is in part to blame for the massive traffic jams at the Finnish-Russian border. The amount of goods entering Russia through Finland has doubled since 2002 to 3 million tons in 2006.

Though it only takes a few minutes to go through the customs at the Finnish side of the border, some times it takes 48-60 hours to pass through the Russian border. Last winter at times the line up of trucks stretched for 60 km

Because of the Russian Bureaucracy, currently each truck has to go through seven Russian officials. Finnish President Tarja Halonen met with President Vladimir Putin in September to deal with the border problems, but so far the agreements haven't been carried out.

The World Economic Forum has dropped Finland's competitive rating by five places. Last year Finland was rated the second most competitive country in the world, after the U. S.. This year, Finland is behind the U.S., Switzerland, Denmark, Sweden and Germany.

Investors have been worried about Nokia's third quarter profit report. Many of the leading tech companies have posted poor 3rd quarter profits. Many of the financial analysts predicted that Nokia will post poor results. Boy, were the people wrong! Nokia's 3rd quarter sales were up 27.7% to \$28.4 billion, and profits up a whopping 85% to \$1.6 billion.

Nokia's share of the world wide cell phone market also rose to 39.5%. During the period from July to October, Nokia shipped out 111.7 million phones.

The highest paid person in Finland last year was Mikael Lilius, the CEO of Fortum, the large Finnish energy company. His pay was \$16.4 million. Next was former Nokia CEO Jorma Ollila at \$8.99 million. In third place was Fortum's Tapio Kuula. As a matter of fact, six of the top 10 highest paid people in Finland work for Fortum.

But if you go on the pay period between July 2005 to July 2006, the highest paid Finn would have been Formula 1 driver, Kimi Raikkonen, whose pay was \$40 million.

Among the highest paid athletes in the world, Raikkonen ranks 4th. Leading the highest paid athletes list is golfer Tiger Woods at \$100 million, next is boxer Oscar de la Hoya at \$43 million, and third is golfer Phil Mickelson, receiving a cool \$42.2 Million.

According to the Swedish newspaper, Dagens Nyheter, Swedish coins will now be made in Finland. Sweden has signed a 3 year agreement to make the Swedish coins at the Finnish Mint in Vanttaa. It is the first time in 1000 years that Swedish coins will be made outside of Sweden.

The Finnish Tiimari chain store that specialize in household interiors and crafts, is buying a similar chain, Gallerix, in Sweden. The new combined chain will have 300 stores in seven countries.

Finland has won the 2007 Ringette World Championship held in Ottawa, Canada. Finland also won the last championship held in 2004 in Sweden.

Ringette is somewhat like hockey, but played with a rubber ring instead of a puck. It is a sport mainly played by women and girls and was first introduced in Canada. In the championship game, the Finns beat Canada 5-4, with an overtime goal by Anne Pohjola. The tournament's MVP was a Finn, Elina Raesola who had 16 goals and 16 assists.

And finally, Heikki was speeding down the Main Street of a small town when he got pulled over by a police officer. "But, officer", said Heikki, "I can explain..."

"And I said to keep quiet! You're going to jail." A few hours later the officer looked in on his prisoner and said, "Lucky for you that the chief Mattila is at his daughter's wedding. He'll be in a good mood when he gets back."

"Don't count on it," says Heikki, "I'm the groom."

FROM THE FCA LIBRARY

Compared to the Winter and Continuation Wars in Finland, not nearly as much has been written about their War for Independence. Immigrant Finns schooled in Finland tell me that it was not even mentioned in their history classes. Perhaps it was too painful to recollect that brother fought against brother.

Finland declared her independence from Russia on December 6, 1917, and I think many of us have had the notion that all was well after that. Such was not the case. The Russians had not left Finland, and Communist forces helped the Finnish Radical Socialists and Communists to revolt. Civil war broke out on January 26, 1918, when the Reds announced that they were in charge. On January 27, the Finnish White army began to chase the Russians out of the country. The Whites, led by Mannerheim, won the war by April 1918, and saved Finland from becoming a Communist state.

This summer I happened to run across four books dealing with the War for Independence, and happenings preceding it.

JONAS OF KIIVIJARVI by Leslie W. Wisuri. As a child, Leslie Wisuri spent a lot of time with his grandfather, Jonas Wisuri, in Iron River, Michigan. During the hours they spent fishing, hunting or just loafing, his grandfather told him stories about the adventures of a hero who was always nameless, but just called "the ghost". This "Ghost" lived in Kivijarvi, Finland during the time of the Russian occupation near the beginning of the 20th century. His resistance against the Russian forces made him a hero in the eyes of the Finns, and eventually inspired them to resist the oppressor and gain their freedom in 1917-18.

Years after his grandfather's death Wisuri realized that the story of the "Ghost", who he was certain was his grandfather, ought to be told. It does make for a very exciting story.

It is unfortunate that Wisuri did not have someone with a knowledge of Finnish and Finnish geography as well as cultural customs to proofread his work before publication. He misspells "Kiivijarvi" with two "T's, explaining that it means "rock lake". "Kivi" is indeed a rock, but "Kiivi", as he spells it, is a kiwi bird. In one instance he has a husband and his pregnant wife cover the distance from Kivijärvi to Helsinki on foot in five days, an impossibility, since Kivijärvi is 215 miles north of Helsinki "as the crow flies". There are other discrepancies, which I won't mention; perhaps you can spot them.

In spite of the fact that the errors and discrepancies are a bit jarring, the book is an interesting read. You will find it in fiction, under F We.

VILHO, FINNISH FREEDOM FIGHTER by Leslie W. Wisuri. This is a sequel to the above, this time based on what Wisuri imagined happened to the Ghost's friend Vilho, after the Ghost and his wife escaped to America. Under Vilho's leadership many are drawn to the resistance movement, and eventually Finland becomes independent in 1917, and truly free in 1918. You will find this book on the shelf beside the above, F Wi.

IMARINMAA by Artturi Leinonen. In 1952 Leinonen wrote a novel similar to the above two. It is the fictional story of Pentti Metsäpelto who is also drawn into the underground resistance movement, which eventually led to the Civil War, also called the War for Independence. This is in ficiton, F Le.

ILKAN JA POUTIN POJAT by Artturi Leinonen. I was indeed amazed to find that this book, a donation from a member, was written by the author of the above novel. The interesting thing is that he wrote it in 1919, shortly after the war was over. He himself was in the thick of things and he describes events as he saw them. He gives detailed information, such as how many Finns, and from which villages went to Germany for training and returned to fight as officers. There are many more interesting details, as well as pictures of numerous soldiers who fought for the Whites. This is in non-fiction, 947.1 Le.

You will find a few more books on the War for Independence by looking in the card catalog under FINLAND-HISTORY-REVOLUTION. Biographies of Mannerheim, of which we have several, will also contain such information.
