### News From Finlandia Gardens

Firstly, we wish to thank our garden associates, FCA members, and friends for their support of our gardens during these difficult economic times. We have been able to continue building our gardens and we hope you will stop by and notice our improvements.

Eight cherub statues have been added to the Wedding Circle across the bridge. We have added a cacti garden at the side of the garage and a minipergola near the wetland.

Our vegetable gardens are doing well despite the incursion of a number of groundhogs. Two have been taken to "greener pastures" if that is possible, but "big mama" continues to enjoy our goodies.

We are extending the stone surface in the West Gardens making walking easier and improving the overall appearance of the gardens. A rain garden has been added near the front to absorb excess water that accumulates in rainy weather.

The stone path between the front parking areas has been completed adding a finishing touch to the adjoining gardens.

We have been enjoying the tree swallows that nested at the rear of the property as well as the goldfinches and killdeer. A number of desirable wild flowers are seen in our wetland areas which provide seed for our many birds. One evening we noted a flock of goldfinch swoop in and feast on thistle seed.

### **FINLAND TODAY**

First, Finland's President Tarja Halonen received a video phone call from the International Space Station. Making the call was astronaut Timothy Kopra. Kopra is the "Finnish" astronaut. The American astronaut Kopra's grandparents had emigrated from Finland to the U.S. During the 14 minute call, President Halonen asked Kopra about saunas. said Kopra to President Halonen: "It would be a wonderful extension to have a sauna aboard....I miss sauna and my family, but it is a great experience."

In a study done at the University of Kuopio in Finland and the Kaiser Permanente in California, elevated cholesterol levels in midlife, even levels considered borderline, significantly increase the risk of Alzheimer's disease and vascular dementia later in life. The study was four decades long with 9,844 men and women taking part. People with high cholesterol levels had 66% increase in Alzheimer's later in life. Even borderline cholesterol in midlife increased the risk of vascular dementia by 52%. The study was published in the Dementia and Geriatric Cognitive Disorder Journal.

The Finnish Kone Corp has acquired the Bridgeport, Connecticut based Brown Elevator Inc. Brown installs and repairs elevators. Its employees will be transferred to other Kone locations in Connecticut.

The number of church weddings continues to decrease in Finland. As recent as 2000, 80% of all weddings took place in churches. But by 2007 it had dropped to 60%, and last year it was down to 57%.

At the Finland Rally Championship, held in Jyvaskyla, it was the "hometown boy", also the "birthday boy", Mikko Hirvonen (29), who came in first place. It was Hirvonen's third straight victory, placing him three points ahead of Sebastian Loeb of France in the overall points total. Another Finn was also on the podium at Jyvskyla as Jari-Matti Latvala came in third. As a matter of fact, there were five Finns in the top ten. It was also a big day for the Ford Focus team as it placed five cars in the top ten, including Hirvonen and Latvala. Formula One World Champion Kimi Raikkonen making his World Rally Championship debut, crashed his car on the final stage of the race. At the time he was in 15th place.

Helsinki was the last stop for the New Zealand basketball team on its European tour. Despite being out rebounded 38-13, Finland beat New Zealand 102--91. One of the problems New Zealand had was turnovers. They had 24 to Finland's 10.

At the World Masters Track and Field Championships held in Lahti, Finland, the men's ages 45--49 group 100 meter champion was Nnamdi Anuim of Finland. Anuim was born in Nigeria.

The Finnish national sport, pesapallo, or Finnish baseball, has enjoyed a big revival this summer. So far this summer at the major league level, attendance is about 42% higher than last year at the same time. The Finnish "major league" teams are not just in large cities like here in the U.S., but also in small towns. The last time that I checked the standings in the Superpesis League, Vimpelin Veto was in second place. Vimpeli is a town of about 3,500 inhabitants.

In the currency exchange: one Euro is worth \$1.41.

# FROM THE FCA LIBRARY

No visit to Finland is complete without a trip to the Seurasaari open-air museum in Helsinki. It will give you an idea of what Finland probably looked like when your grandparents or great-grandparents still lived there.

Long before Henry Ford conceived of the idea of Greenfield Village in Dearborn, Michigan, a professor in Finland by the name of Axel Olavi Heikil founded an open-air museum (ulkomuseo) on Seurasaari, an island on the outskirts of Helsinki. The idea of an open-air museum was quite new In 1909; the Skansen Museum in Sweden preceded the Heikel concept and no doubt provided a model.

Heikel's plan was to bring to the island typical buildings from all over Finland in order to display folk architecture and show how people in earlier times lived.

The first buildings, the Niemelä tenant farmhouse and its surrounding outbuildings, were moved to the island in 1909 from Konginkangas. This farmstead dates to 1721 and was occupied by the same family for six generations. The original owner was Lasse Turpeinen, The main room of the farmhouse was chimneyless, a savupirtti or "smoke room". Whenever a fire was lit, smoke in gathered In the upper part of the room and gradually escaped through an opening in the ceiling. The sauna was the oldest building on the farm and provided temporary shelter for the family before the other buildings were built. Other buildings include storehouses, a dairy, barns, and a boat house.

Ivar's farmstead, from Närpiö in southern Ostrobothnia, was built as a parsonage, and is an example of a genteel home of the mid-1700s. It was remodeled in 1819 for the visit of Czar Alexander I, for the building had been converted to an inn by this time. The entire upper story was renovated for the czar and his retinue.

The Kahiluoto manor, from the parIsh of Taivassalo, has fine examples of Dutch-tile fireplaces ("kaakeliuuni") and other elegant furniture typical of wealthy homes in the mideighteenth century.

The Antti farmstead wIth its enclosed farmyard, from Western FInland, is the scene of many folk dance presentations and plays. Inquire at the Helsinki City Tourist Office so you can schedule your visit to coincide with a presentation there.

In 1939 the museum acquired a Karelian farmhouse from Suojarv in Border Karella (presently in the Soviet Union.) This building provided shelter for both people and animals. This is typical of the large Karelian farmhouses which were often three stories, with animals, a root cellar and storerooms on the first floor, while people lived upstairs. The inhabitants were Greek Orthodox; reminders of their faith still remain.

Eight complete farmsteads are included in the island's almost-l00 buildings.

The Seurasaari collection also includes several charming barns and granaries collected from throughout Finland. They are of typical log construction, many with an outside loft, which was used as sleeping quarters in the summer.

Lapland is also represented in the island's collection by a barn and turf-roof cottage as well as a "tree storehouse", a little house built atop a tall stump. Meat and fish were stored in the latter, keeping it safe from wild animals.

The Karuna Church, dating from 1686 and the oldest building in the museum, has an interesting history. A young officer, Arvid Horn, fell in love with his cousin, who was too closely related to be allowed to marry him. However, determined Arvid kidnapped a clergyman and held him hostage until he performed the ceremony. Since the legality of the marriage was considered questionable, the couple was not allowed to sit in the front pew of the church as had been their custom, nor receive communion. In time Horn built a church of his own, and sat where he pleased. The church was moved to Seurasaarl in 1912, where it is a favorite site for weddings; church services are held there in the summer. Buried in the churchyard are Axel Heikil and his wife.

In 1913 the museum acquired the cottage of Aleksis Kivi, author of SEITSEMÄN VELJESTÄ (THE SEVEN BROTHERS). This cottage is a replica of the original, which burned when it was being reconstructed. Kivi spent the summer of 1863 in this cottage while he completed two plays, "Kullervo" and "Nummisuutarit" ("The Village Cobblers").

Finland's many lakes and rivers have served as transportation routes for centuries. Seurasaari has two examples of church boats used to transport folks to churches which were often quite some distance away. The larger one is from Virrat. It is 21.4 meters long, has 14 pairs of oars, and carried up to 100 people. It was built in 1897.

Also located on the grounds is a festival field, Juhlakenttä, which is the site of frequent concerts and celebrations, the most important being on the eve of Midsummer Day (Juhannus).

To get to Seurasaari from downtown Helsinki, take bus #24 from the Erottaja bus stop in front of the Swedish theater on Mannerheimintie. The three-mile ride takes about fifteen minutes. Cruises from the harbor also go to Seurasaari; inquire at the city tourist office for schedules. The island's buildings are open daily from 11:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Wednesdays until 7:00. However, you may wander the island paths at any hour.
