## SIX HONORED AT SCHOLARSHIP RECEPTION

Five college/university students and one Finnish Center adult volunteer were honored at the FCA's annual Scholarship Reception on Sunday, May 2. The celebration began with thanks to the 135-plus generous donors who gave more than \$7,000 to the Scholarship Fund Drive. First on the program was a presentation by 2008 scholarship recipient Erin Keranen, who had used her award to study for a semester at Finland's University of Jyvaskyla. Erin is now a senior at Central Michigan University, majoring in therapeutic recreation and minoring in gerontology. She showed slides of her experiences in Finland, and described many cultural differences between the Finnish and American cultures.

Scholarship Committee members introduced the five college/university students, who were each awarded \$1,000. Kathleen Carlson, Megan Hella, and Kristina Rikkonen all had received scholarships in previous years. Kathleen, daughter of Kim and Dan Carlson and granddaughter of Hannah and the late Edsel Carlson, is finishing her freshman year at Grand Valley State University, majoring in Biomedical Sciences, with the intention of becoming a pediatrician. Kristina, daughter of Mark and Beth Rikkonen, is also completing her first year. She is at Hope College, studying political science, psychology, and French, with the goal of becoming an international lawyer.

The last few months have been exciting for the Garden Club. David Sharpe and Gayle Gullen gave a presentation in April to over 200 members of the Michigan Garden Club discussing the founding of the Finlandia Gardens and extolling the virtues of the Finnish Center. We have had several visitors to both the center and the gardens as a result of the presentation. In addition to our new human visitors we've been blessed by a wild turkey walking through the gardens!

Please join us on Sunday, June 6th at 1pm in the Childrens' Garden as members of Beach View Elementary School help us dedicate the new Children's Garden. These children have been growing their vegetables from seeds and will be planting them ts in three of the six raised garden beds. At 2pm we three raised beds will be available to children and grand childen of the Finnish Center and the general public for \$2.00 a plot. A responsible adult must be present to supervise each child. We hope to have our eight rain barrels operational by then and you should be able to see our vermiculture [worm composting] in action too! There will be a limited number of small hand tools in the garden, but we encourage you to bring your own tools to insure that you can keep your garden weeded. In the main vegetable garden we still have a few garden plots for rent for \$25 for adults.

Regarding the rain barrels – if anyone has talent installing gutters so that we do not have to hire that out the Garden Club would appreciate that assistance. Also we are in dire need of additional gardeners as we are far behind in our general garden work. All hands have been working hard in the vegetable and Childrens Gardens building barricades against deer, rabbits, and groundhogs.

## **FINLAND TODAY**

The Finnish government has proposed the construction of two more nuclear power plants in Finland. Permission has been granted to the Finnish utility TVO and Fennovoimo, to draw up plans for the new nuclear plants. Fennovoima is a consortium with a German company, E. On AG. The reactors are scheduled to be built by the year 2020.

Finland has four nuclear power plants in operation, and is currently building one of Europe's most advanced pressurized reactors.

The government plans for the nuclear reactors need parliamentary approval, which they will seek this summer, but, the Green Party says it will oppose the plans.

Around the world there are 438 nuclear power plants in operation. Also, there are 52 nuclear power plants under construction, mostly in China.

Finland is the European Union's biggest power consumer per capita, double that of Germany.

Finland imports about 15% of its electricity from Russia. Last year it cost Finland about \$500 million for the Russian electricity.

Remember the Icelandic volcano disrubting airplane travel to Europe? One of the casualties of the air travel ban was the scheduled trip of Secretary of State Hillary Clinton to Finland. It is not known if the trip has been rescheduled.

One of the most memorable trips to Finland by U.S. officials was in 1997 when President Clinton made a stop when he was in a wheelchair after a knee injury and had to be lowered from Air Force One in a food catering truck.

In a recent study by Freedom House, the "Freedom of the Press" took a tumble around the world in 2009. The countries with the highest level of press freedom were led by Finland, Ice-

land, Norway, and Sweden. The U.S. ranked 24th. In last place was again North Korea (196th).

Usually fences are used to keep the animals confined at a zoo. But, at the Korkeasaari Zoo in Helsinki, the fence didn't keep the fox out. The fox climbed the fence and killed the whole flock of 16 flamingos at the zoo. Zoo director, Jukka Salo said that the birds were an important part of the zoo and they will be replaced.

Finland has won the four-nation Euro Hockey Tour title. Through-out the season there were a total of 12 games played in the competing four countries of Czech Republic, Finland, Sweden, and Russia. Finland and Russia finished with 21 points each, 18 points for the Czechs and 12 for Sweden. Finland was the winner over Russia on a tie braker goals differential.

And finally, how the Mackinaw Bridge "really" got built.


## HELP US FIND THE MISSING BOOK

The Writers' Workshop book that was created in 2006 by a group of dedicated FCA members working with David Sharpe has been missing for some time. This was a cultural asset of the FCA that was placed in the foyer for members to freely read. Please let someone in the office, Dave or myself know if you have information on the book's whereabouts or similar materials that might be shared with other FCA members or institutions such as the Heritage Center in Hancock. The book is a collection of the interesting experiences of some of our members who according to Dave had lived in the UP and had migrated to Detroit for employment. The original goal of the workshop expressed in 2006 by David Sharpe is also useful to the FCA Archive Project: "At our first meeting we set goals and agreed that we must archive as much historical information as possible. We have chosen as a mission to gather and preserve written and pictorial material about the history of the Finnish people in the US and particularly in Michigan. This, however, cannot be accomplished without your help, You, the members, children, and grandchildren of early immigrants to the United States have the information we need. Perhaps you have poems, stories, biographies or other written material which has been created by you, your loved ones, or others that you will share with us."

# FROM THE FCA LIBRARY

We have recently acquired two copies of FINNISH AMERICAN RAG RUGS, subtitled Art, Tradition and Ethnic Continuity, by Yvonne R. Lockwood and published by the Michigan State University Press. I can't begin to say enough good things about this beautiful hardback book by one of our own members! All of us are familiar with the rag rugs that covered the floors of our homes as children, but who could have imagined that the history of them and the rag rug culture could fill a 9 x 11 inch, 247 page book, including 200 color ilustrations! Mrs. Lockwood did years of research and interviewed dozens of rag rug weavers both in the Upper as well as the Lower Peninsula for this work.



This is not a how-to book of rug-weaving, but a comprehensive history of the rag-rug-weaving culture, its practitioners (you will surely find at least a few familiar names here), and much about the weaving process.

Mrs. Lockwood devotes an entire chapter to "Finnish American Presence", an interesting look at our Finnish forbears and their as well as our history, mostly that of us Michiganders. She provides keen insight into the

cultural history of the immigrants as well as their descendants -- us. She mentions that although the second generation of Finnish Americans tended to marry outside their ethnic group and forget their roots, since around the 1970's there has been a revitalization of interest in Finnish American culture in subsequent generations. This has prompted, among other things, a resurgence of interest in the rugs that "Gandma used to make".

One entire chapter is devoted to biographies of contemporary weavers and their works, with many colored illustrations of actual rugs they have produced. Among them is a many-page article about our own Laina Lampi, who won first place and best of show at the Michigan State Fair for many years. Many of her lovely rugs are pictured in color, as are rugs of many of the other weavers. Laina and many of the other weavers have inspired and mentored many beginning weavers of the next generation.

An interesting surprise is that many of the rag rug weavers are men, many of whom have also built their own looms, either from instructions, or from memories of looms they had seen in Finland as young lads. The author devotes an entire chapter to the various types of looms, featuring their male owners and/or builders.

Marketing of rag rugs has been mostly done by the weavers themselves, for they can usually sell all they produce with no more advertising than word-of-mouth. The author does not overlook suggestions for caring for rag rugs, for they can last a long time with proper care, and often become family heirlooms.

Whether this book inspires you to try your hand at rugweaving, or merely admire the craft from afar eschewing the time-consuming work involved, you will find it informative and fascinating. You will find it in our library in the crafts section, 746.7 Lo.

## FCA - SUOMIKOULU

September of 2009 FCA-Suomikoulu started to meet in Ann Arbor (not to take possible rental income from FCA) three Sunday's a month for two hours at the time. We submitted a financial support request to Suomi Seura (Finland Society) an organization that processes the applications on behalf of the Educational Ministry in October. End of November we received an e-mail informing us that our application had been accepted and that we would receive financial support towards our new school. This grant abled us to pay the teachers and order text and practice books for the students.

Three groups were established for different age groups. One for young children (0-3) Muskari, which concentrates on music and Finnish children songs. Second and largest group includes children the ages of 4-8 that learn the basics of reading and writing of Finnish language. Third group include children 9 and over that already know how to read and write in Finnish.

We are hoping to apply funding again this coming fall to continue to support the educational mission of FCA.
