THANK YOU

The Cultural Committee arranged another Independence Day Event on December 4th, 2010 at the Finnish Center. Professor Rahkonen gave an interesting slide presentation and talk about Finnish and Finnish American music. Armitage catered the dinner and was able to find some Finnish drinks for the cash bar (Koskenkorva viina and Sinebrychoff Porter beer). The evening closed with music for listening and dancing by Ursula Walker and the Buddy Budson Group.

The Cultural Committee would like to extend their sincere thank you for those who were present and those who gave donations even when not able to attend.

FINLAND TODAY

First, Disneyland Paris is again coming to Finland to recruit summer workers. They hope to sign-up up-to 500 workers from Finland out of 3,000 foreign workers they expect to hire. The workers will receive about \$1,865/month in salary plus the flight ticket to and from Finland to Paris. They will work from March to September. Finnish workers are in demand because many have worked there before, with good results. Finns are perceived to be honest, conscientious workers, with a smile, and a good command of languages.

The STX Finland shipyard in Rauma has delivered the largest ferry to be operating in the English Channel to P&O Ferries. The Spirit of Britain, which will operate between Dover and Calais, will accommodate 2,000 passengers , 195 cars, and 180 trucks. The ship, spanning 700 feet, 11 stories high, is very energy efficient, using 50% less energy than ferries half its size. A sister ship, The Spirit of France, will be delivered in September 2011 from the Rauma shipyard. In October 2010, STX Finland delivered the second of a pair of the world's largest cruise ships to Royal Caribbean Cruise Lines. Each ship cost about \$1.5 billion, spanning 1,200 feet, and can accommodate 6,300 passengers, with a crew of 2,000.

Will Finland become a nuclear manufacturing center? It could happen if the U.S.-Japanese company, the GE-Hitachi Nuclear Energy decides to locate the European manufacturing center in Finland. The facility could bring thousands of jobs.

The Finnish energy company, Fortum Oy, has acquired 85% stake in two Polish power companies. The two companies, ZEC Bytom, and the EC Zabrze, were both bought from the Polish Ministry of Treasury.

The Heksinki-Vantaa airport has received some more accolades. The British magazine, Monocle, has named the Finnish airport as the "Best Airport for Connections." Also, the British consultancy firm, Skytrax, has named the Helsinki--Vantaa airport as the "2010 Best Airport in Northern Europe".

Osku Palermaa of Finland, won his first PBA bowling tour championship. Palermaa, who uses a twohanded delivery style, won the PBA Tour Shark Championship held in Las Vegas.

Finland's Matti Heikkinen made Finnish skiing history in Oberstdorf, Germany. Heikkinen won the 10 + 10 km cross country skiing pursuit race. The 10 +10 km race is where you ski the first 10 km using the "classic" cross country skiing style, and the other 10 km using the "free" or skating style. When you go from the "classic" to "free" style, you also change skis. The "free" style use shorter skis. The race was the 4th stage of the "Tour de Ski" cross country skiing tournament held in central Europe.

FROM THE FCA LIBRARY

We have added the following books to our library:

FINNISH TOUCHES: RECIPES AND TRADITIONS, edited by Jean Liffring-Zug et al. This book is a treasurehouse of information about Finland, Finnish-American history and traditions as well as Finnish recipes. It's worth a look. Dewey number 641.5.

THE FOUNTAINS OF PETRODVERTS by Ilya Gurevich. So, OK, this is not about Finland, but since St. Petersburg is so well-known to Finns, this definitely deserves a place on our shelves. This is a large, lovely picture book of the fountains (144 of them) at the summer palace on the outskirts of St. Petersburg. They are considered "a monument of enormous value", "one of the treasures of world art", and sometimes "the Russian Versailles". The text is in English. You'll find it in 914.7 Gu.

BONE SOUP AND A LAPLAND WIZARD by Timo Koskinen. This is a fictional acount of an odd bachelor and his friend Paavo in the U.P. One of them decides to return to Finland, setting sail across Lake Superior in a makeshift Viking boat! It's in F Ko.

VOICES FROM FINLAND, an anthology of Finland's verse and prose in English, Finnish and Swedish, edited by Elli Tuomi. Dewey number 894.541.

SIBELIIUS AND THE MUSIC OF FINLAND by Veikko Helasvuo, translated from the Finnish by Paul Sjöblom. This is not only about Sibelius, but later Finnish composers and other information regarding music in Finland. It's in biography, Si.

TARJA HALONEN: YKSI MEISTÄ ("one of us") by Hannu Lehtilä. It's a pity this is in Finnish; I'll review it at length in the next issue. It's in biography, Ha.

SUOMI -- VÄRIEN JA LUMEN MAA (FINLAND --LAND OF COLOR AND SNOW) by Reino Luonimo. This beautiful picture book has text in Finnish, English and German. You'll find it in 914.71 Lo.

VÄLKKYVIEN VESIEN SUOMI (LAND OF SPAR-KLING WATERS) by Reino Luonimo. This is a companion to the book above, every bit as colorful. Also in 914.71 Lo. A QUINNESEC KID by Joseph Massie, copyright 2010. This interesting autobiography of a man who grew up in a "suburb" of Iron Mountain was purchased from the author just recently. You'll find it in biography, Ma.

FREDA, MICHIGAN, END OF THE ROAD by Clarence J. Monette. This is another in Monette's "Local history series". 977.4 Mo.

THE HISTORY OF EAGLE HARBOR, MICHIGAN by Clarence J. Monette. Same series as above, same location on the shelf, 977.4 Mo.

IN THE MIDDLE OF EVERYWHERE/KAIKEN KESKELLÄ by Ilpo Okkonen. This is a beautiful picture book of modern Oulu. Text is in Finnish and English. 914.71 Ok.

KAUNIS SUOMI/IMAGES OF FINLAND by Anne Roston and Tim Bird. Another lovely picture book of Finland; brief text includes English. 914.71 Ro.

And finally, two additions to the Juvenile section:

AAPINEN by Urho Somerkivi, Hellin Tynell and Annikki Lehtonen. This is a beginning reader for adult beginners as well as children. Juv 494.541 So.

ENNEN JA NYT by Martti Haavio. This is an advanced reader suitable for adults as well as children. It's in the same area as the above, Juv 494.541 Ha.

ART, TRADITIONS, FOLKLORE

On Sunday, February 13th at 2 pm, Professor Yvonne Lockwood will speak on the craft of rug making at the Finnish Center. This will be of interest to anyone who appreciates art.

She retired from Michigan State University Museum, as curator and senior academic specialist. Her focus was on the culture and folklore of ethnic communities of the upper Midwest.

Yvonne has written numerous articles and publications including the book *Finnish Rag Rugs – Art, Tradition and Ethnic Continuity*, which is the result of over 15 years of field research. This book includes some photos and stories of our earlier weavers at the FCA, for example Laina Lampi one of our founders.

Some of her awards included the Friends of Finland (Flint) awarded her the Finnish American of the year award for "dedicated service to our mid-Michigan community" in 2010. She was also the recipient (with William G. Lockwood) of the 2001 Sophie Coe Prize in Food History.
