### **FINLAND TODAY**

First, according to a study by Italy's Environmental Research Institute, Helsinki is the most environmentaly friendly city in Europe. In second place was Berlin, and in third was Barcelona. At the bottom of the list were Naples and Milan. According to the study, Helsinki has 2 km of bicycle paths for every inhabitant, excellent water treatment plants, lots of parks, and an acceptable level of smog.

A team of researchers at Finland's Turku University suggest that women who raise a family later in life tend to live longer. The study suggest that, atleast in certain populations, having babies later in life may be a sign of physical robustness. The results were unexpected, because it has long been thought that women who have children later in life are less equipped to survive the traumas of children and raising a young family. However, the results fit earlier studies that showed the later a woman goes through the menopause, the longer she is likely to live. The results were published in the British "Royal Society Proceedings".

At the annual Mobile Entertainment Awards, or the "Meffys", held in London, the Nokia N70 multimedia computer was awarded the "Best Mobile Entertainment Handset" award. With the Nokia N70, the user can take high quality photos with its 2 megapixel camera, listen to music on the intergrated digital music player, and stream video over the 3G system.

As you know, this year's Eurovision Song Contest, which the Finnish group Lordi won, was held in Athens, Greece. Next year's contest should be interesting also, because it will be held at the Helsinki Areena. The Areena seats 15,000 spectators. It is expected that about 100 million people in 40 countries will be watching. By the way, the song that Lordi won this year's Eurovision with, is number one on the British "rocksingle" list.

TV isn't free in Finland. To watch TV, any TV, it costs

you 17.95 euros per month, or about 200 euros per year. But, beginning next year, the price will increased to 208.15 euros, which is about \$264.

Now here is something interesting to people who like to read about the Finnish epic, the Kalevala. A graphic art book, 148 pages, of the Kalevala, in English, has been released in Canada by the Aspasia Books. The graphics are by Kristian Huitula, and the text is the Eino Friberg translation of the Kalevala. Check out the website at : www.aspasiabooks.com

Just in case you didn't know yet, the Finnish goal tender, Miikka Kiprusoff, who plays for the Calgary Flames, won two post season awards. One is the Vezina Trophy, for the best goal tender in the NHL, and also the Jenning's Trophy, for the least goals allowed per game (2.03). Teemu Selanne of the Anaheim Mighty Ducks won the Bill Masterton Memorial Trophy for the most determined, hard work in playing the game of hockey. You could say that it's the "Sisu" Trophy.

For the 6th time the "Wife Carrying World Championship " went to the Estonian, Margo Uusorg and his "wife" Sandra Kullas. In second place was Margo's brother Magis Uusorg and his partner Inge Klauson. In third place were the Finns Taisto Miettinen and his "wife" Eija Stenberg. The championship was held for the 11th time in Sonkajarvi.

Give a cheer for the Finns! They sure were very "cheerful" in Oslo, Norway. At the European Cheer Championships held in Oslo, the Finns loaded up with the medals. As I counted them, they received a total of 14 medals, 5 of them gold. Check-out the results on: www.ecc2006oslo.com

The Housing Corporation will not make investments and capital expenditures to benefit for-profit participants. Of course, the Housing Corporation must continue being cognizant of making expenditures which relate to the purpose of the Corporation.

The Housing Corporation has provided that "something more" for the members. The organizations are not merely providing a social/ethnic club. It demonstrates to the city and the surrounding communities that there is a greater purpose for the organization's existence. This is readily acknowledged in the city hall.

### Memorial Fund

# FROM THE FCA LIBRARY

We have observed that several of you have designated the library as the recipient of a memorial gift. We thank you very much!

We will be adding quite a few new acquisitions to our collection in September. Among them will be findings while shopping at the Academic Bookstore in Helsinki, and the North Wind Bookstore in Hancock. We are endeavoring to acquire books about Finland and American Finns written in English, including topics such as biographies, translations of Finnish novels, books about Finnish culture and books presenting Finnish cities. We will also add children's books in Finnish either for children or for grownups studying Finnish to use as beginning readers.

Suggestions for topics you would like to have covered are always welcome. If you would like some input, leave your suggestions in the library mail box, or send a note to or call the librarian (address and phone number are in the FCA directory.)

In the September newsletter we will print a list of the new books we have acquired during the summer.

In doing our inventory we have discovered that many of our books are missing. As is standard library procedure, we charge borrowers for lost books. Our charge is \$10 per lost book, or the price of the book if it is known. The latter applies to our recent acquisitions. # **Greetings from the FCA Senior Housing**

Recently a trustee of the Finnish Center Association asked me why any FCA member should be concerned about the Housing Corporation. In other words the statement reflected the tone of what's in it for me?" I didn't get a. chance to answer the question, since I had a meeting scheduled with Piper Realty Company personnel and they just entered the room at that time. I thought it was best to postpone the discussion for an other time and not delay our meeting.

Since the early days of the FCA, elder housing was part of the discussion of needs and desire. In fact the early pioneers of the FCA. discussed the issue of which they should try to do first - a community center or a housing project. Providing housing for the elderly was always an item in the by-laws and in the organizational documents. The Elders Housing Committee was one of the committees identified in the original bylaws of the FCA. As described in my booklet regarding the Housing Corporation, we fulfilled this major objective.

The Housing Corporation through its three projects has and continues to provide affordable housing for FCA members. Many of the residents who were FCA members at the time they made application for a housing unit, usually found that they were on the fast track on the project waiting lists. Some of our member - residents were provided apartments requiring lower than market rents.

FCA members, who are also members of the FCA Senior Citizens Housing Corporation, should feel proud that they are members of an organization that has fulfilled a major objective and one that continues to serve the needs of some of its members and the general public.

The Housing Corporation has been successful in acquiring all of the investment units of the for-profit limited partners in the Tapiola Village partnership, and has offered the FCA a limited partnership participation in project. This enables the limited partnership to maintain continuity as the owner/mortgagor entity. The non-profit entities will now be the full beneficiaries of the operations of Tapiola Village. The Housing Corporation can now effectively invest its capital into the project (and ancillary investments) without concern of enhancing the profitability of individuals. # VETERAN'S HISTORY PROJECT UPDATE

As most of you know, our Finnish Center Association is in partnership with the Library of Congress to promote, expand and secure the personal histories of our veterans. In the process, American Military History is detailed from the personal stories of individual veterans.

I haven't reported to you, our members, in what seems like quite awhile. Meanwhile, my work goes on. I specialize in World War II Veterans. While eighteen million served from the U.S. alone, as an age cohort, they are the most at risk.

In the last few months, I have video taped the personal World War II story of a combat engineer serving under Patton (who got yelled at by Patton); A submariner aboard the boat U.S.S. Haddo – the Haddo was responsible for sinking six Japanese warships and about as many transports. They were attacked and depth charged several times; A naval aviator who flew a reconnaissance float plane from a launch on board the battleship U.S.S. Maryland. He was involved in the battle for Leyte Gulf in the Philippines and several other south Pacific conflicts; A 40mm gunner on board PT127, also in the pacific. He saw much action on the night raids aboard the fast P.T. boats. This is a sample of some of my more current interviews.

To quote a piece from a VHP interview brochure – "This project, created by Congress, is building a lasting legacy of recorded interviews, memoirs, and other documents to date, since the project was approved unanimously by Congress in 2000, about 40,000 veteran's stories have been collected.
