KITCHEN SANITATION CLASSES

FINLAND TODAY

First, the Finnish National Radio, YLE, celebrated its 80th anniversary in September. The date, September 9th, 1926 was the beginning of regularly scheduled programming in Finland on YLE. YLE TV started regular broadcasts in 1958.

Last year 98% of the Finnish population listened or watched YLE radio or TV for atleast 2 hours per week. YLE also announced that it will have an online service providing hundreds of hours of archieved TV, radio and music programming. You can watch the latest TV news on the internet by going to: www.yle.fi/news/id187.html You need "Real Player" or "Windows Media" to view the news, but you can down load them right at the YLE site. The news are in Finnish and English.

The Saimaa Canal is commerating its 150 anniversary. Saimaa canal officially opened on September 7, 1856. The canal is 43 km long and connects Finnish inland lakes with the ocean. What is unique about the canal, because of political reasons, is that 23 km of the canal is inside Finland, and 20 km is in Russia. Originally it was all in Finland. Currently Finland leases the part that is in Russia. The current lease ends in 2013, but negotiations are in progress to extend the lease for another 30 years. Under the present agreement, Finland pays Russia 10 million euros a year.

Aker Yards in Finland announced the order of 2 new cruise ships by the Norweigen Cruise Lines, worth over 1.5 billion euros. But the ships will not be built in Finland, but instead at its newly acquired ship yard in St Nazair, France. The Aker Yards in Finland are filled to capacity with orders. Currently Aker Yards in Finland, and its sub-contractors are looking for hundreds of new skilled trades people such as welders, sheet metal workers, electricians, carpenters, and engineers.

The Helsinki based, Stora Enso paper manufacturer has bought the US based International Paper's coated publication paper business in Brazil for about \$415 million. The Brazilian plant produces 230,000 tons of coated paper for catalogues, magazines, and inserts. The deal also includes a saw mill operation that produces 83 million board feet of lumber each year. Stora Enso already has a presence in Brazil with a cellulose pulp mill plant in Eunapolis. Enso Stora produces magazine paper, newsprint, fine paper, pulp and packaging board in more than 40 countries.

The head of the Finnish Heart Federation, Professor Pekka Puska, has been named to head the World Heart Federation, headquartered in Geneva, Switzerland. The World Heart Federation consists of about 200 national organizations from 100 countries. The World Heart Federation's mission is to help people achive a longer and better life through prevention and control of heart disease and stroke, with a focus on low and middle income countries.

With the announcement of the retirement of Michael Schumacher from the Ferrari Formula One, F-1, Team at the end of this season, Kimi Raikkonen has been signed by Ferrari for the 2007-2009 seasons. For the last 5 years Raikkonen has been with the McLaren-Mercedes Team. At the recent Italian Grand Prix, Michael Schumacher took the gold with Raikkonen second. Another Finn is joining the Formula One ranks. The Renault Team has announced the signing of Heikki Kovalainen to its F-1 Team. Kovalainen has already logged 28,000 km as Renault's test driver, so he is not altogether new to Renault.

The Atlanta Thrashers of the NHL have announced the signing of goal tender Kari Lehtonen to a new two year contract worth about \$3.7 million.

About a year and a half ago, Finland's former President and army commander, Carl Gustav Mannerheim was voted the greatest Finn of all time. Recently the greatest fictitious Finnish character was voted upon. The winner was Rolli the Troll. Rolli is a long haired forest troll that appears on a popular Finnish children's T.V. program.

Finnish opera singer, Esa Ruuttunen was peddling his bicycle on his way to rehearsals at the Helsinki Opera House when a squirrel ran into his bicycle. The squirrel got caught in the spokes causing Ruuttunen to fall, breaking his nose, and knocking him out. But, he was able to perform at the world premiere of the opera, House of Serpents, in September. The squirrel died in the accident.

FROM THE FCA LIBRARY

I hope all of you had a nice vacation and are all geared up for reading some of the wonderful books we have in our library. Here are some suggestions:

NIKOLAI'S FORTUNE by Solveig Torvik. This is historical fiction in that the events and people are real but some of the extraneous material, conversation and such, is as the author imagined it to have happened. Solveig Torvik was brought up to believe she was Norwegian. However, there seemed to be some family secrets that aroused her curiosity about her heritage. Upon research, she discovered she was 100% Finnish! She found that her grandmother had been sent from Finland as a foster child to a Norwegian family. At that time Finns were put down by the Norwegians and it was actually shameful to be a Finn. Hence the family secrets. The story is told by three generations of women, Solveig, using the name Hanna, being the last. Whence the title? Nikolai was her great-grandfather who came to America and was rumored to have made a fortune, which the family was curious about, as they were about Nikolai's whereabouts or what happened to him. If you don't read anything else this year, don't neglect this. You'll find it in fiction.

SIRKKA by Eila Siren-Perlmutter. This book is also of a biographical nature but is considered his-

torical fiction because some of the story and events have been fictionalized. Nevertheless, this story of an immigrant girl in northern Minnesota would ring true for anyone who grew up in that era. This also can be found in fiction.

Someone has said that laughter is the best medicine. For a medicinal fix, try FINNFUN by Bernhard Hillila. Dr. Hillila has compiled dozens of facts and humorous stories about Finns. (He insists "Yes, Finns DO have a sense of humor.") Just one of his many examples: "Martha Lurvey remembers that it was a long time before she realized that when her mother spoke of lit a Ahon perunoita, she was referring to "Idaho potatoes", not "Ida Aho's potatoes"!

Dr. Hillila didn't run out of examples of Finnish humor when he published FINNFUN, so he wrote a sequel, THE FINNISH LINE, which we also carry. Both books are in the "Wit and Humor" section, call number 808.7.

These and anything from the list of new books acquired this summer (S see FCA Newsletter September 2006) should keep you busy reading for some time.
