# A MEANINGFUL LESSON

When I was a child in elementary school, I was a busy boy. Not only did I drive the teachers to distraction, but my classmates often found my behavior upsetting. This was before psychiatrists and psychologists had come up with the acronymic designations like ADHD, ADD etc. I was a bad boy at that time in history and often my behavior resulted in my being bullied by my peers.

We rode the bus to and from the school which was a mile and a half from my home. Bullying on the bus, which had become a bane of my existence, included my being pinched and punched, stealing my hat or scarf or making remarks reflecting on my qualities became a serious problem for me. Repeated attempts to enlist my parents to my situation fell on deaf ears as they probably figured I was getting what I deserved as they had been living with me for some time.

Finally, the situation came to a head one afternoon on the way home from school. On this day a particularly brutal, chubby boy was victimizing me. Everyone was watching what Willie was about. When we came to the bus stop, just ahead of where I usually got off, I made a decision. I told Willie that it was time for us to get off the bus and deal with the situation. Willie eagerly agreed. This raised quite a bit of interest among the other passengers, I suspect even the bus driver was watching and listening.

When Willie and I got off the bus it began. I began pounding him with all my might. I knew it was "do or die." Suddenly it was over. Willie was crying and I had been victorious. The bus moved on and I walked the rest of the way home. I guess the word got around as I never was picked on again after that and I never thought about it anymore.

About fifty years later, I was in the doctor's office many miles from where I was raised. The nurse called out my name, "David Sharpe". Suddenly an older man stood up and came up to me asking, "Are you the David Sharpe from Taylor?" "Yes" I replied. With an admiring grin on his face, he said, "I remember the day when we were on the school bus and Willie was picking on you and you both got off the bus and you beat him up. He was always picking on many of us kids. It was amazing what you did." He looked at me like I was Mohammed Ali, with admiration. I was astounded. He remembered that incident from fifty years before as if it had happened only yesterday. That impressed upon me that one can never know the impact you have on others, even after fifty years. A sobering thought for parents, teachers, and all those we come in contact with in life.


# **EMBRACE ADVERSITY**
