SO YOU WANT TO WEAVE RAG RUGS!

The history of rag rug weaving at the Finnish Center goes 'way back. Many women who learned to weave as young people gathered to form the FinnWeavers organization. The group learned from each other many aspects of rag rug weaving thereby improving their skills. Also, they taught others who wanted to learn this craft and the FinnWeavers became an integral part of the Finnish Center.

In past years members and guests of the FCA were interested in learning more about the weaving of rag rugs. In 2016 the first of our formal classes was offered to the pleasure of the students. It was planned to offer additional classes but COVID and other situations got in the way.

Finally, the FCA is pleased to announce that a class will be offered in October of this year! Sandy Lampi Scheel will be the instructor and the barn loom that was donated several years ago will be used by the students to learn how to weave. This class will be offered on **October 17, 18 and 19 beginning at 10:00 am** in the morning. The class will consist of information sharing, demonstrations, discussions, hands on projects as well as weaving. Please contact Sandy for additional information or to register for the class (see below.)

There will be a \$50.00 fee made payable to the instructor at the beginning of the class. This will cover transportation for the instructor as well as hand-outs and weaving supplies for each student. When signing up for this class each student will be given a list of supplies they should bring. Also, students will be encouraged to bring a light lunch and a beverage of their choice.

If this class is of interest to you but the dates do not fit in your schedule, please let Sandy know and we should be able to schedule another class that is better for you. EIGHT DEADLY SHOTS

Directed by Mikko Niskanen, Finland, 1972

Did you watch/will you watch any of the Finnish movies at FinnFest USA this August? There were no movies by Mikko Niskanen on the FF schedule, but the Detroit Institute of Art's Detroit Film Theatre will be showing one on Sunday, August 27, at 1:00 pm. Come to the DIA and join other FCA members and other Fennophiles in seeing this unusual film. It is in Finnish, with English subtitles. Well-known Finnish director Aki Kaurismaki has this to say about the movie: "The crowning achievement of Finnish filmmaking and one of the masterpieces of European cinema."

The DFT will screen the movie only once, in its entirety. It is 316 minutes long, plus intermission minutes. (NOTE: this is 5 hours, 16 minutes.) The Crystal Gallery Café will be open during intermission, which is on the second floor of the Film Theatre.

The Film Theatre brochure gives this description of EIGHT DEADLY SHOTS: This long unsung landmark of Finnish cinema, inspired by an actual 1969 event, is the magnus opus of the virtually unknown (in the U.S.) writer-director-actor Mikko Niskanen. He delivers a shattering performance as Pasi, a farmer who struggles to support his family through occasional odd jobs and who seeks aid and comfort in alcohol-making it, selling it, drinking it-which creates turmoil within his family, brings him into conflict with the law, and leads him on a gradual, likely slide toward oblivion. Presented here in its original four-chapter format as made for Finnish television in 1972, this monumental vision of human endurance is the rare, great epic woven from the fabric of ordinary life." It was restored by Martin Scorsese's Film Foundation, with funding by the Lucas Family Foundation.

Ticket prices: \$9.50, general admission; \$7.50, DIA members, seniors, students; \$35, five discount passes. Go to the Crystal Gallery Café during intermission and look for your other FCA members and friends. Henry Jay Naasko July 14, 1941-July 9, 2023



The Finnish American Singers of Michigan (FASM) are sad to share the news of the passing of their former director, Henry (Hank) Naasko on July 9, 2023. After suffering from ill health for quite a while, his wife Sandy relayed that he passed away peacefully under hospice care with his beloved granddaughters playing music and singing at his side.

Hank was the director of the FCA's Finlandia Male Chorus before leading FASM as its director for more than 25 years. Choir concerts, and certainly rehearsals, were punctuated with stories of his youth among his many Upper Peninsula Finnish relatives. Their love of music fostered his own desire to pursue music in college, leading to a music/history education degree at his beloved University of Michigan. Remaining an avid fan, Hank attended U of M football games faithfully for more than 50 years, despite rain, heat, or snow! He was also extremely proud of his college years singing with the Michigan Men's Glee Club, the second oldest collegiate chorus in the United States, and long acclaimed as one of the finest male choruses in the world.

His teaching career took place in Livonia, MI where he taught both middle and high school music as well as American history. Whether appearing in class dressed in historical costume, sharing molasses cookies made with his grandmother's recipe to illustrate the sugar trade, or encouraging the shy singer to shine, he engaged his students and built up thriving choral music programs at the schools where he taught. One member of the Finnish American Singers, Nancy Jacobs, has fondly shared stories about singing 35 years ago as a student in an elite choral group, that Hank directed. Other members recall experiencing Hank's performance abilities with the Ann Arbor Civic Theater in productions of *A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum* and *Les Misérables*.

His musical influence has spread to his close-knit family as well. All three of his daughters are instrumental musicians and his granddaughters are both instrumentalists and vocalists. The Finnish American Singers were pleased to have two of the girls play and sing at one our concerts and always enjoyed hearing of their musical achievements. Family time at the Naasko home invariably included music!

This was never more evident than during the Christmas season, which for Hank began in the early fall when he started listening to some of his more than 300 Christmas albums and CDs! He sheepishly once told the choir about having to pull over in his little red convertible because a Christmas song was playing that had brought him to tears and he couldn't see to drive! He was unabashedly sentimental, and music was often the key that unlocked his tears.

Although the singers of FASM as well as his other friends and family will certainly share tears of laughter, sentiment, memories, and sadness at the loss of this man, we appreciate the influence he has had in our lives and in all those around him. He will be missed.
