FINNISH AMERICAN SINGERS OF MICHIGAN

October is a leading month for the Finnish American Singers of Michigan. We have been hard at work practicing the music leading to our November 26th Christmas concert. Our GREENS sale was held this month, taking orders leading to a November delivery of the fragrant holiday greens. We rested after our September pasty extravaganza when we participated in the production of 800 plus yummy pasties leading to our reprise of the event in November just before the Scandinavian Market.

In a similar way, the holiday music we will be singing is, "leading" us, both singers and listeners through the December holiday. It is truly Christmas: From Start to Finnish! Both Michigan and Finland anticipate, some eagerly some not, the arrival of a White Christmas. Irving Berlin composed the classic song that was the linchpin for a movie of the same title. We have the addition of a solo verse in Finnish, emphasizing the American-Finnish connection. How about a chilly but fast sleigh ride? In The Sleigh, we go "Lightly flying o'er the snow ... with sleigh bells ringing, gaily singing, merrily we go." "Fallen Leaves"/"Kuolleet lehdet" directed by Aki Kaurismäki


